We have always been a small, lean, and nimble organization, so we never stray—even as the world shifts around us—from our core mission: protecting birds of prey. Since our founding in 1970, an unwavering focus on this niche in the natural world has conserved not only birds of prey, but also a wide swath of the world's biodiversity, the animals and habitat that birds of prey need to survive.

Our willingness to be out in the field every day is one key to our success, past and future. In Madagascar, nearly 20 years of hands-on training, conservation, research, and working with local communities has paid off with species rediscovered, new species found, and real protection for globally significant wetlands and rainforest. In the rugged backcountry of Arizona and Utah, biologists track each California Condor and screen for lead poisoning to ensure the survival of this ancient and ecologically important scavenger. In the Dominican Republic we are implementing an innovative technique called "assisted dispersal" by shifting nestlings of the critically endangered Ridgway's Hawk from nests subject to human persecution to release sites in better protected habitat.

Dedicated field work requires an equally dedicated support staff and board of directors. We deeply appreciate Ian Newton's steady guidance as chairman of the board through a challenging transition period. And we welcome Lee Bass, our new chairman of the board, whose business expertise and tenure on the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission will see us through the challenges ahead.

No other organization does what we do. And no one could do it as well. Looking to the future, I'm confident that with your help The Peregrine Fund will emerge from the world's current economic challenges stronger than ever. Thank you for sharing in our vision.





## 40 years of experience in restoring endangered raptors uniquely positions us to address population crises in birds of prey.



Fewer than two dozen California Condors remained in the wild when our recovery efforts began.

#### California Condor

Two more wildhatched condor chicks joined the growing flock of California Condors in northern Arizona in 2008. The vear marked a major milestone in condor restoration: for the first time since 1987, more California Condors were flying in the

wild than were being held in captivity for breeding purposes. We are proud and encouraged by this sign that our efforts to save this species—once reduced to just 22 individuals are succeeding.

In FY 2008, there were 66 wild condors in Arizona, where our recovery project is focused, and more than a dozen awaiting release at our Vermilion Cliffs site. More than 50 captive condors at the World Center

for Birds of Prey in Boise—the world's largest captive flock—produced 11 chicks that will eventually join the wild population.

#### **Northern Aplomado Falcon**

With more than 40 wild pairs of Aplomado Falcons nesting in Texas in 2008, we are growing closer to the time when the bird can be removed from the Endangered Species List. Eliminated from their native landscape more than a half-century ago, a self-sustaining population appears to be established in South Texas. We have now released more than 1,500 Aplomado Falcons to the wild. In 2008, our captive flock produced 155 juvenile falcons for continued release in West Texas and New Mexico.

Private landowners are essential partners in this effort, proving that endangered species can co-exist with humans. We also rely on federal and state land managers who participate in the recovery program.

#### **Harpy Eagle**

The last Harpy Eagle being held in captivity for breeding purposes at our facility in Panama was released into Soberania National Park on a sunny morning in July 2008. The moment marked the end of a 10-year propagation effort and the start of a new monitoring phase. All Harpy Eagles released in Panama and Belize will be tracked, some with satellite telemetry,

to increase our knowledge of these magnificent residents of the Latin American rainforest. The single greatest threat to this species remains human persecution, specifically shooting.

#### **Other milestones:**

- Orange-breasted Falcon—Seven captivebred falcons were released to the wild in Belize just two years after the birds were successfully bred in captivity for the first time since 1980.
- Philippine Eagle—Our partners, the Philippine Eagle Foundation, released a captivebred male and a rescued female in collaboration with local residents. An education program provides a cultural context for understanding and respecting the eagle and the importance of protecting its habitat with an expressed goal of eliminating shooting of the eagles.
- Ridgway's Hawk—In partnership with the Sociedad Ornitológica de la Hispaniola, we relocated juveniles of this critically endangered species to protected private land to better disperse breeding pairs outside of Los Haitises National Park.

# When people are inspired to protect birds of prey, they also protect habitat and biodiversity.

The challenges of raptor conservation are immense, yet our experience tells us that we can achieve success when we help inspire local people.

#### Madagascar

After years of hard work and perseverance, a large wetlands called Manambolomaty Lakes will be added to the System of Protected Areas of Madagascar. The designation conserves habitat for the critically endangered Madagascar Fish Eagle and other endemic species. For nearly two decades, The Peregrine Fund has trained and assisted associations of local residents to sustainably manage their natural resources. We are working with communities in two other areas to protect habitat for the endangered Madagascar Serpent Eagle, Red Owl, Pochard, and other species.

#### Texas

In 2008, we helped enroll more than 10,000 acres of suitable Aplomado Falcon habitat in the Safe Harbor Program, bringing the total to 2.1 million acres in Texas, a state that is almost entirely privately owned. The program is essential to recovery of the Aplomado Falcon, which requires grasslands teeming with bird life to survive. The Safe Harbor was developed with

the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as a "hold harmless" agreement to reduce private landowner concerns over endangered species and provide access to critical habitat for the falcon.

#### **Arizona**

We partner with the Arizona Game and Fish Department and hunting organizations to offer hunters in northern Arizona a non-lead alternative to traditional ammunition in areas where we are restoring the California Condor. Throughout the condor's range, landowners are proud to see these ancient scavengers returning to the sky. The condor has revealed the environmental effect associated with the toxicity of lead. The recovery of condors would bode well for other scavenger species that are similarly affected by toxic lead ammunition remains, such as Bald Eagles, Golden Eagles, and some mammals—including humans.

# **All conservation is local.** Support for students, organizers, educators, and emerging biologists is fundamental in developing countries.

#### **Dominican Republic**

We conducted an experimental release in 2008 of the critically endangered Ridgway's Hawk in partnership with the Sociedad Ornitológica de la Hispaniola. While the surviving pairs reside exclusively in Los Haitises National Park, the experiment relocated juveniles to protected private land with a goal of better distributing breeding pairs in numerous protected locations. The Society and The Peregrine Fund developed and executed a conservation education effort focused on communities around the release sites.

#### **South America**

Our research on the Andean Condor and the Galapagos Hawk grew substantially with two new partnerships and four students in Ecuador. Students in Brazil, Colombia, Peru, and Argentina continued to receive training and grants to fund ongoing studies.

#### **Central America**

Our corps of Embera-Wounaan technicians and volunteers empowered with new knowl-

edge of raptor research and conservation grew to more than 40 this year. This group forms the foundation for our long-term study of Harpy Eagle population biology in Darien Province of Panama.

#### **East Africa**

Catastrophic wildlife deaths from misuse of the pesticide Carbofuran in Kenya prompted our support of a Kenyan graduate student to conduct a study on the chemical's ecological risks to scavenging birds. Elsewhere, one of our students successfully completed her doctorate on the Mackinder's Eagle Owl in Central Kenya, and we provided a grant to Makere University to evaluate raptor abundance in Uganda.

#### Madagascar

The Manambolomaty Lakes region is being protected as a result of our nearly two decadeslong partnership with local residents. The internationally recognized wetlands is home to the endangered Madagascar Fish Eagle and other species found nowhere else on Earth. Since 2006, we have extended this partnership model to two other regions of Madagascar to protect precious habitat for raptors and other species threatened by human settlement and resource exploitation.

Since 1990, our financial support, training, and education of numerous Malagasy students seeking doctoral, master's, and bachelor degrees in science has resulted in the majority of them going on to influential careers in conservation.

#### **Asia-Pacific**

Unsustainable population growth and loss of the rainforest threaten the survival of the Philippine Eagle, one of the largest eagles in the world and a global symbol of conservation need. At most, only a few hundred eagles remain, making our work in support of the Philippine Eagle Foundation essential. Our technical advice and financial support allow the foundation to achieve much-needed habitat conservation and species restoration, and expand science capacity in the Philippines.

In South Asia, we have detected the first hint of vulture populations stabilizing following The Peregrine Fund's scientific breakthrough that resulted in the 2006 ban of the veterinary drug Diclofenac. In 2004, we showed that the drug was responsible for the swift and massive dieoffs of vultures in India, Pakistan, and Nepal. We cooperate with numerous groups monitoring vulture numbers and we update and maintain the web-based Asian Vulture Population

Project, which has developed into an important information resource for scientists around the world dealing with this environmental and cultural tragedy.

#### **Global Raptor Information Network**

The users of this free service are the researchers and conservationists in developing countries who need access to scientific information where such resources are limited. In 2008, our online encyclopedia providing up-to-date technical information on diurnal birds of prey received more than

92,000 visitors. The average visit time was 77 minutes—and we supplied free PDF copies of 1,249 articles, which we distributed throughout the world.

# Appropriate **conservation action** springs from knowledge and understanding.

Our expertise in raptor conservation is respected around the world.

The Peregrine Fund is first and foremost a conservation organization, but we use science to gather facts on which to base conservation decisions. Since 1970, we have published more than 1,100 scientific articles, reports, and books, including 57 in 2008.

#### **California Condor**

Our landmark study on the effects of spent ammunition on wildlife raised knowledge and awareness of this issue to new heights in 2008. Our research showed that lead ammunition used by hunters sends tiny fragments of lead farther into a game animal's body than anyone knew, making gut piles and the carcasses of unretrieved animals lethal sources of lead for California Condors and other scavengers. All consumers of game meat, even humans, may be exposed to lead from spent ammunition.

In May 2008 we hosted the first international conference of its kind, "Ingestion of Lead from Spent Ammunition: Implications for Wildlife and Humans." More then 150 biologists, health professionals, and representatives of the shooting sports industry benefited from this eye-opening exchange of information. The effects continue to ripple throughout the world. Food

banks revised methods for distributing venison donated by hunters, and several states and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control instituted their own studies, illustrating the concept that birds of prey are often indicators of environmental contamination with important effects in people.

#### **Neotropics**

The Harpy Eagle Day Festival in Panama City drew 6,000 people in 2008, nearly twice the crowd of the previous year. The phenomenal growth of this event, which we began four years ago, builds understanding and appreciation for Panama's national bird with games, puppet shows, folkloric dancing, a costume contest, and other family activities. The festival is a key part of our program to promote pride and reduce shooting of this spectacular rainforest raptor.

In 2008 we trained 60 teachers in methods of fostering conservation among students in rural schools located near Harpy Eagle habitat, bringing the total number of schools using our raptor education guide in their classes to 145. A DVD about our Neotropical Education Program and related activities was translated to English using subtitles to broaden its use as an educational and promotional tool.

#### **World Center for Birds of Prey**

In July, we reached a record high number (4,308) of monthly visitors to our World Center for Birds of Prey, suggesting that our interpretive center must expand to accommodate the growing demands of the public. Plans to build an outdoor condor exhibit blossomed into a 20-year planning document that outlines an ambitious revision of our visitor facilities. Improvements include a relocated parking lot to make way for the condor exhibit, other bird displays, and a green gathering space in the heart of our hilltop campus.

In 2008, we fascinated large crowds with new indoor and outdoor flight demonstrations featuring our education birds. These programs increase the public's understanding of the behavior and ecological value of raptors and generate local support for our conservation programs worldwide.

Also, we added a regular schedule of public tours to The Archives of Falconry to showcase one of the world's best collections of rare art, books and artifacts related to falconry and the spectacular new Arab Heritage Wing.


